

Who Are You? What Does the Evidence Say?

During the first few days of school, it is important to get to know each other. One way to accomplish this is for us to share important stories with each other about our lives. For this assignment, you are asked to bring to UMA 3-4 objects/pieces of **evidence** that tell stories about yourself that you would like the rest of us to know.

Rather than a simple show-and-tell, however, your classmates will become historians and attempt to tell your stories by examining and evaluating the objects/pieces of evidence/artifacts that you bring to school. To prepare for this activity, please complete the following:

1. Bring home the zip lock bag given to you in social studies today.
2. Consider some stories about yourself that you would like to share with your classmates, and then select 3-4 objects/pieces of evidence that tell a story about you. The objects **must** fit into the ziplock bag! Now, for some of your stories finding objects/pieces of evidence that fit into a ziplock bag may be a problem. If, for example, I want to share my passion for canoeing, I certainly cannot put one of my canoes into a lunch bag! In this case, I will need to use an object/piece of evidence other than a canoe to share. Can you help me think of a way to do this?
